

1 **An act proposed by the Financial and Cash Management Task Force relating to**  
2 **governmental operations and creating a new Enterprise Financial Business**  
3 **Operations Office, submitted to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the**  
4 **House on January 30, 2009.**

5  
6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

7  
8 Section 1. Section 20.13, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

9  
10 20.13 Enterprise Financial Business Operations Office — The Enterprise Financial  
11 Business Operations Office is created within the Department of Financial Services. The  
12 Office shall be a separate budget entity that shall not be subject to control, supervision, or  
13 direction by the Department of Financial Services, which may provide administrative  
14 support to the Office upon request. To the extent that the Office receives administrative  
15 support from the Department, it shall abide by the Department’s policies and procedures  
16 applicable to the support provided.

17  
18 (1) The Office shall be headed by the Governor and Cabinet and directed by the  
19 Enterprise Financial Business Operations Officer. The Officer shall be appointed by a  
20 vote of the Governor and Cabinet consisting of at least three affirmative votes, with both  
21 the Governor and the Chief Financial Officer on the prevailing side. The Officer shall  
22 serve at the pleasure of the Governor and Cabinet and may be removed by a three to one  
23 vote in favor of removal.

24  
25 (2) The Office shall exercise general supervision over the Florida Financial Management  
26 Information System and shall:

27 (a) Adopt an annual “Strategic Enterprise Financial Business Operations Plan” or “Plan”  
28 as defined in s. 215.913;

29 (b) Enforce the implementation of effective internal financial controls and enterprise  
30 financial business processes;

31 (c) Serve as a clearinghouse for enterprise information relative to the development,  
32 implementation and evaluation of enterprise financial business process improvements;  
33 and

34 (d) Pursuant to ss.120.536 (1) and 120.54, adopt rules to implement ss. 215.91 - .911.  
35

36 (3) The Officer shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

37 (a) Supervise the development and adoption of the Plan;

38 (b) Recommend effective internal financial controls and enterprise financial business  
39 processes;

40 (c) Monitor the implementation of internal financial controls and enterprise financial  
41 business process improvements;

42 (d) Identify issues that interfere with standardization of core business functions  
43 associated with State financial management;

44 (e) Provide periodic reports to the Governor and Cabinet on the implementation of  
45 internal financial controls and enterprise financial business processes including issues

46 that are interfering with the implementation that need to be addressed by the Governor  
47 and Cabinet;  
48 (f) Review and approve business cases for modification or replacement of any of the  
49 Florida Financial Management Information System’s functional information subsystems  
50 defined in s. 215.93;  
51 (g) Review and approve project charters for projects to modify or replace any of the  
52 Florida Financial Management Information System’s functional information subsystems  
53 defined in s. 215.93;  
54 (h) Monitor the progress of all projects to modify or replace any of the Florida Financial  
55 Management Information System’s functional information subsystems defined in s.  
56 215.93; and  
57 (i) Provide periodic reports to the Governor and Cabinet as to the progress of projects to  
58 modify or replace any of the Florida Financial Management Information System’s  
59 functional information subsystems defined in s. 215.93.  
60  
61 (4) No later than 14 days prior to implementation, the Officer shall notify in writing the  
62 chairs of the legislative fiscal committees and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court  
63 regarding the adoption of or modification to an enterprise financial business operations  
64 rule or policy.

65  
66 Section 2. Section 20.131, Florida Statutes is created to read:

67  
68 20.131 Enterprise Financial Business Operations Council -- The “Enterprise Financial  
69 Business Operations Council” or “Council” is created as an advisory body to the  
70 Enterprise Financial Business Operations Office as established in s. 20.13 in the  
71 execution of its duties and responsibilities.

72  
73 (1) The Council members shall include:

- 74 (a) The Enterprise Financial Business Operations Officer, who shall serve as chair of the  
75 Council;  
76 (b) Cash Management subsystem enterprise business owner or designee;  
77 (c) Financial Management subsystem enterprise business owner or designee;  
78 (d) Purchasing subsystem enterprise business owner or designee;  
79 (e) Personnel subsystem enterprise business owner or designee;  
80 (f) Planning and Budgeting subsystem enterprise business owner or designee;  
81 (g) Representative for the State Agencies’ Administrative Services Directors;  
82 (h) Representative for the Attorney General;  
83 (i) Representative for the Agricultural Commissioner;  
84 (j) Executive Director for Agency for Enterprise Information Technology or designee;  
85 (k) Any additional members that have been added by the chair.

86  
87 (2) The Executive Director for Agency for Enterprise Information Technology is  
88 authorized to establish and chair an “Enterprise Financial Business Operations Integration  
89 Sub-council” or “Sub-council” that will advise the Enterprise Financial Business  
90 Operations Council on information technology matters.

91

- 92 (3) The members of the Sub-council shall include:  
93 (a) Cash Management subsystem technical subject matter expert;  
94 (b) Financial Management subsystem technical subject matter expert;  
95 (c) Purchasing subsystem technical subject matter expert;  
96 (d) Personnel subsystem technical subject matter expert;  
97 (e) Planning and Budgeting subsystem technical subject matter expert;  
98 (f) Representative for the State Agencies Chief Information Officers;  
99 (g) Any additional members that have been added by the chair.

101 Section 3. Section 215.91, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

103 215.91 Florida Financial Management Information System; ~~board; council.~~--

104

105 (1) It is the intent of the Legislature that the executive branch of government, in  
106 consultation with the legislative fiscal committees, specifically design and implement the  
107 Florida Financial Management Information System to be the primary means by which  
108 state government managers acquire and disseminate the information needed to plan and  
109 account for the delivery of services to the citizens in a timely, efficient, and effective  
110 manner.

111

112 (2) The Florida Financial Management Information System shall be a unified enterprise-  
113 wide information system providing fiscal, management, and accounting support for state  
114 decision makers. It shall provide a means of coordinating fiscal management information  
115 and information that supports state planning, policy development, management,  
116 evaluation, and performance monitoring. The Florida Financial Management Information  
117 System shall be the primary information resource that provides accountability for public  
118 funds, resources, and activities.

120 ~~(3) The Financial Management Information Board Enterprise Financial Business~~  
121 ~~Operations Office shall define standardized financial business processes provide the~~  
122 ~~overall framework within which the Florida Financial Management Information System~~  
123 ~~will operate. The Office board, through the Florida Financial Management Information~~  
124 ~~System Coordinating Council, shall adopt policies and procedures to:~~

125 (a) Strengthen and standardize the fiscal management, ~~and~~ accounting practices, and  
126 enterprise financial business processes of the state;

127 (b) Improve internal financial controls;

128 (c) Simplify the preparation of objective, accurate, and timely management and fiscal  
129 reports; and

130 (d) Provide the information needed in the development, management, and evaluation of  
131 public policy and programs.

133 ~~(4) The council shall provide ongoing counsel to the board and act to resolve problems~~  
134 ~~among or between the functional owner subsystems. The board, through the coordinating~~  
135 ~~council, shall direct and manage the development, implementation, and operation of the~~  
136 ~~information subsystems that together are the Florida Financial Management Information~~  
137 ~~System. The coordinating council shall approve the information subsystems' designs prior~~

138 to the development, implementation, and operation of the subsystems and shall approve  
139 subsequent proposed design modifications to the information subsystems subject to the  
140 guidelines issued by the council. The coordinating council shall ensure that the  
141 information subsystems' operations support the exchange of unified and coordinated data  
142 between information subsystems. The coordinating council shall establish the common  
143 data codes for financial management, and it shall require and ensure the use of common  
144 data codes by the information subsystems that together constitute the Florida Financial  
145 Management Information System. The Chief Financial Officer shall adopt a chart of  
146 accounts consistent with the common financial management data codes established by the  
147 coordinating council. The board, through the coordinating council, shall establish the  
148 financial management policies and procedures for the executive branch of state  
149 government. The coordinating council shall notify in writing the chairs of the legislative  
150 fiscal committees and the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court regarding the adoption of,  
151 or modification to, a proposed financial management policy or procedure. The notice  
152 shall solicit comments from the chairs of the legislative fiscal committees and the Chief  
153 Justice of the Supreme Court at least 14 consecutive days before the final action by the  
154 coordinating council.

155  
156 ~~(5)~~(4) The Florida Financial Management Information System and its functional ~~owner~~  
157 information subsystems shall be compatible with the legislative appropriations system,  
158 and they shall be designed to support the legislative oversight function. The Florida  
159 Financial Management Information System and its functional ~~owner~~-information  
160 subsystems shall be unified with the legislative information systems that support the  
161 legislative appropriations and legislative oversight functions. The Florida Financial  
162 Management Information System and its functional ~~owner~~ information subsystems shall  
163 exchange information with the legislative information systems that support the legislative  
164 appropriations and legislative oversight functions without conversion or modification.  
165 Any information maintained by the Florida Financial Management Information System  
166 and its functional ~~owner~~ information subsystems shall be available, upon request, to the  
167 information systems of the legislative branch.

168  
169 ~~(6)~~(5) The Florida Financial Management Information System and its functional ~~owner~~  
170 information subsystems shall be designed to incorporate the flexibility needed to respond  
171 to the dynamic demands of state government in a cost-conscious manner. The Florida  
172 Financial Management Information System shall include applications that will support an  
173 enterprise-wide information retrieval system that will allow the user to ask general  
174 questions and receive accurate answers that include assessments concerning the  
175 qualifications of the data.

176  
177 ~~(7)~~(6) The Florida Financial Management Information System and each of its functional  
178 ~~owner~~-information subsystems shall strive to employ a common set of operations that  
179 make the system accessible to agency program managers and statewide decision makers.  
180 Data shall be easily transferred from the functional ~~owner~~ information subsystems to  
181 Florida Financial Management Information System applications and also among the  
182 functional ~~owner~~-information subsystems. The functional ~~owner~~ information subsystem  
183 shall identify shared data-gathering needs in order to minimize the duplications of source-

184 entry input. ~~The coordinating council shall ensure that a~~ All organizations within the  
185 executive branch of state government shall have access to and use the Florida Financial  
186 Management Information System for the collection, processing, and reporting of financial  
187 management data required for the efficient and effective operation of state government.

188  
189 ~~(8)~~(7) The Florida Financial Management Information System, through its functional  
190 ~~owner~~ information subsystems, shall include a data-gathering and data-distribution  
191 facility that will support a management and decision-making information system that  
192 collects and stores agency and statewide financial, administrative, planning, and program  
193 information to assist agency program managers and enterprise-level decision makers in  
194 carrying out their responsibilities.

195  
196 Section 4. Section 215.911, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

197  
198 215.911 Enterprise Strategic Financial Business Operations Plan-- The Enterprise  
199 Financial Business Operations Office as established in s. 20.13 with the assistance of the  
200 Enterprise Financial Business Operations Council as established in s. 20.131, will  
201 develop an Enterprise Strategic Business Operations Plan or "Plan". The Plan shall  
202 contain an assessment of the effectiveness of State core business functions associated  
203 with financial management and shall establish goals for improvements in enterprise  
204 financial business processes, enterprise reporting, and enterprise data management in  
205 order to enhance the effectiveness of State financial management. The Plan is to be  
206 submitted to the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives  
207 annually beginning on October 1, 2010.

208  
209 (1) The Plan shall include:  
210 (a) Current enterprise financial business processes being followed by the agencies and/or  
211 enterprise business owners and recommendations on enterprise business process  
212 improvements that support standardization, improve internal controls, or enhance  
213 financial reporting;  
214 (b) Financial information that is currently provided with the enterprise business  
215 processes and recommendations that enhance financial reporting;  
216 (c) Current data management for the Florida Financial Management Information  
217 System's functional information subsystems and recommendations on measures to  
218 improve data security, data integrity between the functional subsystems, or elimination of  
219 data redundancy between functional subsystems;  
220 (d) Hardware, software and information technology environments that are currently  
221 being used by the Florida Financial Management Information System's functional  
222 information subsystems and recommendations on measures to improve access controls,  
223 system performance, or hardware or software acquisitions that support the  
224 standardization of enterprise financial business processes;  
225 (e) Recommendations on enterprise financial business rules, policies and procedures that  
226 support the standardization of enterprise business processes or enterprise reporting;  
227 (f) Documentation on the life cycle costs to maintain the Florida Financial Management  
228 Information System and any cost that is associated with recommendations provided in the  
229 Strategic Financial Business Operations Plan.

Section 5. Section 215.92 Florida Statutes is amended to read:

215.92 Definitions relating to Florida Financial Management Information System Act.--  
For the purposes of ss. 215.90-215.964:

(1) "Agency" means any entity within the executive branch of government that is appropriated funds by the Legislature.

~~(1)~~(2) "Auditable" means the presence of features and characteristics that are needed to verify the proper functioning of controls in any given information subsystem.

~~(2) "Board" means the Financial Management Information Board.~~

~~(3) "Coordinating council" or "council" means the Florida Financial Management Information System Coordinating Council.~~

(3) "Enterprise business owner" means the agency listed in 215.94, Florida Statutes, that has the legal responsibility to ensure that the Florida Financial Management Information System's functional subsystem is designed, implemented, and operated in accordance with ss. 215.90-215.94.

(4) "Council" means the Enterprise Financial Business Operations Council, as established in s. 20.131.

~~(4)~~(5) "Data or data code" means representation of facts, concepts, or instructions in a formalized manner suitable for communication, interpretation, or processing by humans or by automatic means. The term includes any representations such as characters or analog quantities to which meaning is, or might be, assigned.

(6) "Enterprise financial business process" means a group of tasks that is carried out for the recording and reporting of financial information for the State's core business functions: procurement, human resource management, budget execution, cash management, and financial reporting. The tasks should be automated, should be executed by all state agencies, and have an affect on the State's financial records.

~~(5) "Design and coordination staff" means the personnel responsible for providing administrative and clerical support to the board, coordinating council, and secretary to the board. The design and coordination staff shall function as the agency clerk for the board and the coordinating council. For administrative purposes, the design and coordination staff are assigned to the Department of Financial Services but they are functionally assigned to the board.~~

~~(6) "Functional owner" means the agency, or the part of the judicial branch, that has the legal responsibility to ensure that a subsystem is designed, implemented, and operated in accordance with ss. 215.90-215.96.~~

(7) "Functional system specifications" means the detailed written description of an information subsystem. These specifications are prepared by the functional owner of the system; describe, in the functional owner's language, what an information subsystem is required to do; and describe the features, characteristics, controls, and internal control measures to be incorporated into the information subsystem. Such specifications are the basis for the preparation of the technical system specifications by the functional owner.

(8) "Information system" means a group of interrelated information subsystems.

(9) "Information subsystem" or "subsystem" means the entire collection of procedures, equipment, and people devoted to the generation, collection, evaluation, storage, retrieval, and dissemination of data and information within an organization or functional area in order to promote the flow of information from source to user.

(10) "Life cycle costs" means the total costs of ownership for the Florida Financial Management Information System, including the costs for planning, design, construction/acquisition, implementation, maintenance, renewal/rehabilitation, financial depreciation, and replacement or disposal; excluding costs associated with state agencies' business systems that may perform the same business processes as a Florida Financial Management Information.

(11) "Modification" means a technical change to a functional information subsystem that will affect how a task identified in an enterprise financial business process is to be performed;

(12) "Office" means the Enterprise Financial Business Operations Office, as established in s. 20.13.

(13) "Officer" means Enterprise Financial Business Operations Officer, as established in s. 20.13.

(14) "Project" means a coordinated series of actions undertaken to modify or replace a functional information subsystem.

(15) "Project charter" means a formal document that describes the objectives, scope, duration and organizational structure for a project.

(16) "Project governance" means a written delegation of authority that defines the roles and responsibilities of participants at all levels in the decision-making process, identifies the levels of operational decision-making, designates a clear line of decisional authority, and provides a clear process for escalating issues to the appropriate decision-making level for resolution.

Section 6. Section 215.93 Florida Statutes is amended to read:

322 215.93 Florida Financial Management Information System.--

323

324 (1) To provide the information necessary to carry out the intent of the Legislature, there  
325 shall be a Florida Financial Management Information System. The Florida Financial  
326 Management Information System shall be fully implemented and shall be upgraded as  
327 necessary to ensure the efficient operation of an integrated enterprise-wide financial  
328 management information system and to provide necessary information for the effective  
329 operation of state government. Upon the recommendation of the ~~coordinating council~~  
330 Council and approval of the ~~board~~ Officer, the Florida Financial Management  
331 Information System may require data from any state agency information system or  
332 information subsystem or may request data from any judicial branch information system  
333 or information subsystem that the ~~coordinating council and board~~ Officer has have  
334 determined to have statewide financial management significance. Each functional ~~owner~~  
335 information subsystem within the Florida Financial Management Information System  
336 shall be developed in such a fashion as to allow for timely, positive, preplanned, and  
337 prescribed data transfers between the Florida Financial Management Information System  
338 functional ~~owner~~ information subsystems and from other information systems. The  
339 principal unit of the system shall be the functional ~~owner~~ information subsystem, and the  
340 system shall include, but shall not be limited to, the following:

341 (a) Planning and Budgeting Subsystem.

342 (b) ~~Florida Accounting Information Resource~~ Financial Management Subsystem.

347 (2) Each information subsystem shall have an functional enterprise business owner ;  
348 ~~who may establish additional functions for the subsystem unless specifically prohibited~~  
349 ~~by ss. 215.90-215.96.~~ The enterprise business owner must submit a business case  
350 justifying any modifications to or replacement of the information subsystem to the  
351 Council for review and approval by the Officer. However, without the express approval  
352 of the ~~board Officer upon recommendation of the coordinating council~~, no functional  
353 enterprise business owner nor any other agency shall have the authority to establish or  
354 maintain additional subsystems which duplicate any of the information subsystems of the  
355 Florida Financial Management Information System. Each ~~functional~~ enterprise business  
356 owner shall solicit input and responses from agencies utilizing the information  
357 subsystem. Each ~~functional~~ enterprise business owner may contract with the other  
358 ~~functional~~ enterprise business owners or private sector entities in the design,  
359 development, and implementation of their information systems and subsystems. Each  
360 ~~functional~~ enterprise business owner shall include in its information subsystem functional  
361 specifications the data requirements and standards of the Florida Financial Management  
362 Information System as approved by the ~~board~~ Officer. Each ~~functional~~ enterprise  
363 business owner shall establish ~~design teams~~ a project charter and project team that shall  
364 plan and coordinate the design and implementation of its subsystem within the  
365 ~~framework established~~ project charter and project governance as defined in s. 215.92(15)  
366 approved by the board Officer. ~~The design teams shall assist the design and coordination~~  
367 ~~staff in carrying out the duties assigned by the board the coordinating council.~~ The

368 ~~coordinating council shall review and approve the work plans for these projects.~~ The  
369 enterprise business owner shall provide regular reports on the status of projects to the  
370 Council and the Officer.

372 (3) The Florida Financial Management Information System shall include financial  
373 management data and utilize the uniform chart of accounts ~~approved~~ established by the  
374 Chief Financial Officer. Common financial management data shall include, but not be  
375 limited to, data codes, titles, and definitions used by one or more of the functional ~~owner~~  
376 subsystems. The Florida Financial Management Information System shall utilize  
377 common financial management data codes. The council shall recommend and the ~~board~~  
378 Officer shall adopt policies regarding the approval and publication of the financial  
379 management data. The Chief Financial Officer shall adopt policies regarding the approval  
380 and publication of the chart of accounts. The Chief Financial Officer's chart of accounts  
381 shall be consistent with the common financial management data codes established by the  
382 ~~coordinating council~~ Officer. Further, all systems not a part of the Florida Financial  
383 Management Information System which provide information to the system shall use the  
384 common data codes from the Florida Financial Management Information System and the  
385 Chief Financial Officer's chart of accounts. Data codes that cannot be supplied by the  
386 Florida Financial Management Information System and the Chief Financial Officer's  
387 chart of accounts and that are required for use by the information subsystems shall be  
388 approved by the ~~board~~ Officer upon recommendation of the ~~coordinating~~ Council.

390 (4) The Florida Financial Management Information System shall be designed, installed,  
391 and operated in a fashion compatible with the legislative appropriations system.

393 (5) ~~Functional~~ Enterprise business owners are legally responsible for the security  
394 indtegrity of all data records existing within or transferred from their information  
395 subsystems. Each agency and the judicial branch shall be responsible for the accuracy of  
396 the information entered into the Florida Financial Management Information System.

398 (6) All agency financial business processes shall be in conformance with rules, policies,  
399 and procedures promulgated by the Office for the enhancement and standardization of  
400 enterprise financial business processes.

402 Section 7. Section 215.94, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

404 215.94 Designation, duties, and responsibilities of ~~functional~~ enterprise business  
405 owners.—

406

407 (1) The Executive Office of the Governor shall be the ~~functional~~ enterprise business  
408 owner of the Planning and Budgeting Subsystem, which shall be designed, implemented,  
409 and operated in accordance with the provisions of ss. 215.90-215.964 and chapter 216.  
410 The Planning and Budgeting Subsystem shall include, but shall not be limited to,  
411 functions for:

412

(a) Development and preparation of agency and judicial branch budget requests.

- 413 (b) Analysis and evaluation of agency and judicial branch budget requests and  
414 alternatives.
- 415 (c) Controlling and tracking the allocation of appropriations, approved budget, and  
416 releases.
- 417 (d) Performance-based program budgeting compliance evaluations, as provided in the  
418 legislative budget instructions pursuant to s. 216.023(3).  
419
- 420 (2) The Department of Financial Services shall be the ~~functional~~ enterprise business  
421 owner of the Florida ~~Accounting Information Resource~~ Financial Management  
422 Subsystem established pursuant to ss. 17.03, 215.86, 216.141, and 216.151 and further  
423 developed in accordance with the provisions of ss. 215.90-215.964. The subsystem shall  
424 include, but shall not be limited to, the following functions:
- 425 (a) Accounting and reporting so as to provide timely data for producing financial  
426 statements for the state in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles.
- 427 (b) Auditing and settling claims against the state.  
428
- 429 (3) The Chief Financial Officer shall be the ~~functional~~ enterprise business owner of the  
430 Cash Management Subsystem. The Chief Financial Officer shall design, implement, and  
431 operate the subsystem in accordance with the provisions of ss. 215.90-215.964. The  
432 subsystem shall include, but shall not be limited to, functions for:
- 433 (a) Recording and reconciling credits and debits to treasury fund accounts.  
434 (b) Monitoring cash levels and activities in state bank accounts.  
435 (c) Monitoring short-term investments of idle cash.  
436 (d) Administering the provisions of the Federal Cash Management Improvement Act of  
437 1990.  
438
- 439 (4) The Department of Management Services shall be the ~~functional~~ enterprise business  
440 owner of the Purchasing Subsystem. The department shall design, implement, and  
441 operate the subsystem in accordance with the provisions of ss. 215.90-215.964. The  
442 subsystem shall include, but shall not be limited to, functions for commodity and service  
443 procurement.  
444
- 445 (5) The Department of Management Services shall be the ~~functional~~ enterprise business  
446 owner of the Personnel Information System. The department shall ensure that the system  
447 is designed, implemented, and operated in accordance with the provisions of ss. 110.116  
448 and 215.90-215.964. The department may contract with a vendor to provide the system  
449 and services required of the Personnel Information System. The subsystem shall include,  
450 but shall not be limited to, functions for:
- 451 (a) Maintenance of employee and position data, including funding sources and  
452 percentages and salary lapse. The employee data shall include, but not be limited to,  
453 information to meet the payroll system requirements of the Department of Financial  
454 Services and to meet the employee benefit system requirements of the Department of  
455 Management Services.
- 456 (b) Recruitment and selection.  
457 (c) Time and leave reporting.  
458 (d) Collective bargaining.

459

460 (6)(a) Consistent with the provisions of s. 215.86, the respective functional enterprise  
461 business owner of each information subsystem shall be responsible for ensuring that:

462 1. The accounting information produced by the information subsystem adheres to  
463 generally accepted accounting principles.

464 2. The information subsystem contains the necessary controls to maintain its data  
465 integrity and data security, within acceptable limits and at an acceptable cost.

466 3. The information subsystem is auditable.

467 (b) The Auditor General shall be advised by the functional enterprise business owner of  
468 each information subsystem as to the date that the development or significant  
469 modification of its functional system specifications is to begin. The Auditor General shall  
470 provide technical advice, as allowed by professional auditing standards, on specific issues  
471 relating to the design, implementation, and operation of each information subsystem.

473 (7) The Auditor General shall provide to the ~~board and the coordinating~~ Officer and the  
474 Council the findings and recommendations of any audit regarding the provisions of ss.
