**ORDER APPROVING RECEIVER'S
DISCHARGE ACCOUNTING, DIRECTING FINAL DISCHARGE,
AND AUTHORIZING DESTRUCTION OF OBSOLETE RECORDS**

THIS MATTER came on upon the Florida Department of Financial Services', as Receiver of Cumberland Casualty & Surety Company (the "Receiver"), Motion for Order Approving Discharge Accounting, Directing Final Discharge, and Authorizing Destruction of Obsolete Records. The Court having reviewed the pleadings of record and being otherwise fully informed:


It is therefore **ORDERED and ADJUDGED** as follows:

- A. Approving and adopting the Receiver's Discharge Accounting Statement;
- B. Authorizing and directing the Receiver to retain the projected funds that are available for "wind up" expenses of the Receiver and authorizing that any excess funds remaining be paid to the Insurance Regulatory Trust Fund;
- C. Authorizing the Receiver, after final discharge, to destroy any obsolete records in the Receiver's possession;
- D. Authorizing the Division of Rehabilitation and Liquidation to remit to the

Insurance Regulatory Trust Fund any assets which may remain, or subsequently be recovered, in the estate following the discharge of this receivership in an attempt to fully reimburse the Insurance Regulatory Trust Fund;

E. Directing, without further order of this Court, the final discharge of the Receiver of its responsibilities in the Cumberland receivership estate effective as of 11:59 p.m. on September 30, 2011.
