Changes in Testing

We are rapidly moving to electronic applications. Those wishing to submit paper applications or support materials requiring hard copy transaction will be accepted but will take longer to process and will soon cost more in fees. Our testing partner, Promissor, has taken the name of its parent company PearsonVue. Once approved to test you will now be directed to PearsonVue.com instead of Promissor.com to arrange for your test location, date and time. Test banks will be updated this year to reflect new curriculum, questions based upon course objectives and more contextual questions that require the application of acquired knowledge rather than recall. Later this year practical testing for Firefighter II will be expanded, and started for Firefighter 1. These changes are being instituted on a training center by training center basis during the next several months. To date, 16 of our 33 certified training centers have received training and orientation on the new practical exam.

REVISIONS TO FAC 69A-37 (Firefighter 1 and 2, Training Centers)

Changes to Florida Administrative Code 69A-37 have been *proposed*, rule workshops continue throughout Florida

These changes reflect changes to the NFPA 1001 standard. Florida's last major revision was in 1997 and this allows us to bring our curriculum up to date and compliant to our accreditation through the ProBoard. An additional hearing is planned in the Panhandle in March. 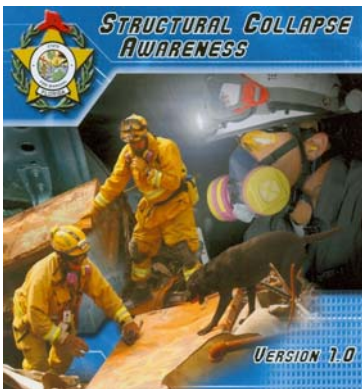
- *Temporarily* changes the name of Firefighter 1 to "Part 1" and Firefighter 2 to "Part 2". This will be changed back to Firefighter 1 and 2 by statute during the upcoming Legislative session.
- Adds two wildland firefighting courses to Firefighter 1, S-130, 190 at the request of the Florida Fire Chief's Association and the Division of Forestry (31 hours) and the new federal requirements for Traffic Safety, and Hazardous Materials Operations (Operations used to be in Firefighter II).
- Firefighter I (or Part 1) goes to 235 hours, with 123 hours being "practical" however some classroom components can be taken on computer and much of the practical components can be done 1on1.
- Firefighter I still at local VFDs or training centers (live fire components of class may have to be at a certified fire training center if VFD doesn't have Live Fire Instructors or props)
- Firefighter II (or Part 2) goes to 241 hours, for a total of 476 + 24 hours of course review for 500 hours. The Dept of Education now has Firefighter 1 and 2 at 450 reimbursable hours.
- Firefighter II includes 40 hours of Firefighter Safety & Survival
- Updates training center requirements to reflect current training objectives.

Look for upcoming revisions to FAC 69A-62 (Uniform Minimum Firefighter Employment Standards)

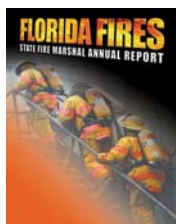
