(1) Michigan has received two early access distributions from the Receiver: \$69,031.66 by court order dated 10/15/04 and \$4,100.97 by court order dated 4/27/05. They also received \$140,877.43 from a special deposit under their control that was not a disbursement of funds from the Receiver.

(2) Puerto Rico has received two early access distributions from the Receiver: \$2,882,883.51 by court order dated 10/26/04 and \$191,867.65 by court order dated 4/27/05. They also retained \$1,133,978.30 that is treated as early access per court order dated 10/28/04.

(3) A court ordered early access agreement dated 8/5/04 allowed the TDOI to release \$7,005.53 of a statutory deposit to the TIGA for admin expenses. The remainder of the statutory deposit (\$62,655.70) was released to the Receiver as a general asset of the estate.

Notes to Financial Statements**

Dated December 31, 2013

1. **Estate Information.** Insurance Company of Florida was a property and casualty company domiciled in Florida and placed in liquidation on December 29, 1992.
2. **Basis of Presentation.** The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on a modified cash basis of accounting using a fiscal year of July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014. The assets are stated at their estimated realizable values, while the liabilities are stated at their gross filed amounts and are periodically adjusted as evaluated, adjudicated and/or paid. Interest is accrued and reinsurance receivables are only posted when billed to reinsurers. In addition, the statements do not provide accruals for all future administrative expenses to liquidate the estate or costs to pursue or litigate claims against others.
3. **Unaudited.** The accompanying financial statements have not been audited by an independent certified public accountant and no opinion is expressed on their compliance with generally accepted accounting principles.
4. **Statement Format Changes.** On July 1, 2001, the Receiver converted accounting systems, which resulted in the historical accounting data being presented differently in this set of financial statements than the previously prepared statements for this estate. Because the new system uses a more detailed chart-of-accounts and summarizes data into categories different than previously used, the 'Since Date of Liquidation' column of historical data on the 'Statement of Cash Receipts and Disbursements' may not correspond directly to previous statement presentations. Users of this "Liquidation to-date" information should solicit additional information from the Receiver before making assumptions about the data.
5. **Pooled Investments.** The majority of the invested assets of the estates are combined into two main pooled accounts: the Receiver's operating account held at the Bank of America and the Special Purpose Investment Account held at the State of Florida Treasury. Each estate's share of the pooled investments is presented on the accompanying financial statements as "Pooled Cash Due from the Admin Fund".
6. **Reinsurance.** Reinsurance receivables have resulted from losses that have been paid and billed to the reinsurer(s). The financial statements reflect the gross amount of the billed losses less an allowance for any receivable(s) currently considered to be uncollectible. The receivable amount may include paid losses that are ceded to one or more reinsurance contracts being collected on behalf of the Receiver by an intermediary or by the Receiver's staff.
7. **Advance to Guaranty Association(s).** Represents funds advanced to guaranty associations for the payment of covered claims and expenses. The guaranty association is obligated to promptly return any or all of these funds if the Receiver determines that repayment of claims of equal or superior priority is necessary.
8. **Claims.** Unless otherwise noted, the Statement of Affairs contains claim liabilities by priority class pursuant to 631.271, Florida Statutes. Unless otherwise stated, the claim liabilities reported are gross filed, unadjudicated, and have not been reduced by any early access payments from the Florida Receiver. Claims liability numbers are based upon information and documentation provided to the Receiver as of December 31, 2013.
 - The Class V Employee Claims have been adjudicated and reported net of distributions. A 100% distribution was authorized in September 1993. The Receiver distributed \$6,430.54 to approved employee claims.
 - All Class I, Class II and Class III claims have been evaluated and reported to the court except for Puerto Rico Guaranty Fund and Maderas Tradaeas, Inc. The Second Interim Claims Report has been filed with the court and the Notices of Determination were mailed February 18, 2011. The claims report was filed with the courts on February 7, 2011. The objection filing deadline was April 21, 2011.
 - The guaranty fund and the claimants residing in states of New Mexico, North Carolina, South Carolina and Virginia were evaluated and re-classified to Class VI. The guaranty funds "self-helped" to their statutory deposit.
 - No objections were filed.
 - Sufficient assets appear to be available to make a distribution to Class III claimants. Class III return premium claims have been evaluated along with the claims filed by citizens of Puerto Rico.

- A Third Interim Claims Report was filed with the court on September 26, 2011. The claim filed by the Puerto Rico Guaranty Fund and the claim filed by Maderas Tradaeas, Inc. in the amount of \$8,700,000 were not included in the Third Interim Claims report. They will be reported at a later date upon the legal conclusion of the Maderas claim. The objection filing deadline was December 2, 2011.
 - Two claimants filed objections to the Receiver's recommendation. The objections have been resolved and withdrawn.
9. **Contributed Equity – State of Florida.** The Receiver will, from time to time, expend public funds to carry out certain duties during the course of liquidating an insurance company. The Division accounts for these expenditures as a contribution of equity by the State.
10. **Excess (Deficiency) of Assets over Liabilities.** The excess or (deficiency) represents the estimated realizable value of assets after deducting the current estimate of liabilities. This excess or (deficiency) does not take into consideration any estimates for future administrative costs to liquidate the estate or costs to pursue or litigate claims against others.
