ORDER APPROVING RECEIVER'S SECOND INTERIM CLAIMS REPORT

THIS CAUSE having come before the Court on the Florida Department of Financial Services, as Receiver for Senior Citizens Mutual Insurance Company (hereinafter "Receiver"), Amended Motion to Approve Second Interim Claims Report, on December 14, 2015, and the Court having reviewed the pleadings of record, heard argument of counsel for Elderly Housing Development and Operation Corporation (EHDOC) and Region Nine Housing Corporation (Region Nine), and otherwise being fully advised in the premises, it is hereby ORDERED AND ADJUDGED as follows:

1. The Receiver's Second Interim Claims Report (the Report) is hereby approved but neither EHDOC nor Region Nine shall be deemed to have waived any right under chapter 631, Florida Statutes to object to the Report as to the value of their respective claims. *EHDOC & Region Nine are still fully entitled to file objections within the appropriate deadline.*
 2. The Receiver is authorized and directed to notify claimants of the Receiver's recommendations regarding their claims by U.S Mail to the last known address of any entity or person as shown in the Receiver's files.
 3. All entities or persons who object to the Receiver's recommendations in its Report shall file in writing an objection with the Clerk of this Court. All

objections are due by the objection filing deadline established by the Receiver which will be no less than forty-five (45) days from the date of this Order and should be filed at:

4. Objections shall clearly state the name, mailing address and/or email address, and claim identification number of the person filing the objection, and shall clearly state the factual and legal reason(s) supporting the objection and claim. Any person filing an objection is required to submit documentation along with the objection to support his/her/its claim. Neither the Receiver nor the Court will consider any information or documentation submitted after the objection is filed unless good cause is shown for the late submission of documentation, or unless discovery, if necessary, results in additional information not available to an objector before the due date of the objection to the Report. All objections not resolved by the Receiver shall be set for hearing at a later date and the objectors so notified.
5. The Receiver's procedure for addressing late filed objections as set forth in the Motion is approved.

6. The Receiver's sample Notice of Determination is approved.
7. The Receiver's request to search for change of address information when applicable and to use the change of address information for future mailings without further direction of this Court is approved.
8. The Receiver's recommendation that the distribution amounts intended for claimants who did not respond to the Receiver's inquiries, where inadequate address information exists, where mail is returned to the Receiver, or claimants cannot be located, be transferred to the Florida Department of Financial Services, Bureau of Unclaimed Property, is approved, pending the outcome of any claimants' objections and further Order of this Court.
9. The date of filing the original Motion for Approval, November 18, 2015, is the last date that the Receiver may accept any further Assignments of Claim; provided, however, nothing in this Order shall prohibit either EHDOC or Region Nine from submitting documentation of their authority to act on behalf of the entities for whom they already have submitted claims. Such documentation shall be submitted to the Receiver on or before the date for objecting to the Report. If documentation of their authority to act for those entities is submitted, the Receiver shall consider that documentation in making any further recommendations to the Court.
10. After the deadline for objections, service on any claimant shall be to the address provided by the claimant in the claimant's objection. Receiver is authorized to search for change of address information when applicable, and

to use the change of address information for future mailings without further direction of this Court.

11. Counsel for EHDOC and Region Nine will be provided with copies of other claimants' objections to the Report should any be received by the Receiver, within five business days of receipt.
12. The Receiver is authorized to remit the funds due to any claimants where mail is returned, or that cannot be located, to the Unclaimed Property Bureau of the Florida Department of Financial Services, pending the outcome of any claimants' objections and further Order of this Court.
