As someone that's been in small business my entire life, I believe in the power of private enterprise, but private enterprise must respect property rights and the way big tech firms leverage our data looks more like theft than a legitimate economic transaction. There's nothing more valuable to a person than one's own identity, and big tech has figured out a way to cash-in while leaving the consumer in the dark. It's time we recognize the reality that consumers have a property interest in the private information big tech companies are buying and selling on a daily basis.


