This week, I wrote an Op-Ed in Florida Politics about how Florida must push back against the IRS's power grab. Only career government bureaucrats would think that the best way to fight fraud is to vastly grow the amount of access the federal government has to transactions Americans make. While we have made great strides in recovery, with more than \$8.5 billion in insurance claims paid, this dangerous storm created a lasting impact that we will never forget. I want to remind Floridians that Hurricane Season lasts through November 30th and I encourage everyone to stay on guard and ensure you're prepared before the next storm takes aim at our state. Thank you to Governor DeSantis for his unwavering support of the hard-working Panhandle communities impacted by this historic storm.
