



Holocaust Survivor Fee Waiver Program

The right thing to do is the only thing to do.

The Florida Department of Financial Services helps Holocaust survivors obtain wire transfer fee waivers on European reparation payments. Since the program began, around 12,500 survivors and their families in Florida have faced international wire transfer fees ranging from \$10 to \$40 per transaction. Currently, 20 financial institutions in Florida participate in the Fee Waiver Program, agreeing to waive these fees on reparation payments. Survivors incurring such fees are encouraged to seek assistance from our office.

The Department's Holocaust Victims Assistance Program website, (www.MyFloridaCFO.com/Division/Consumers/Holocaust) provides a list of participating financial institutions in Florida, detailed information and contact numbers for Holocaust insurance claims, a generic fee waiver form for financial institutions and the Holocaust Victims Assistance Act. While no one can ever fully repay those who suffered through this atrocity, the Department of Financial Services will do all it can to keep money in their pockets.
