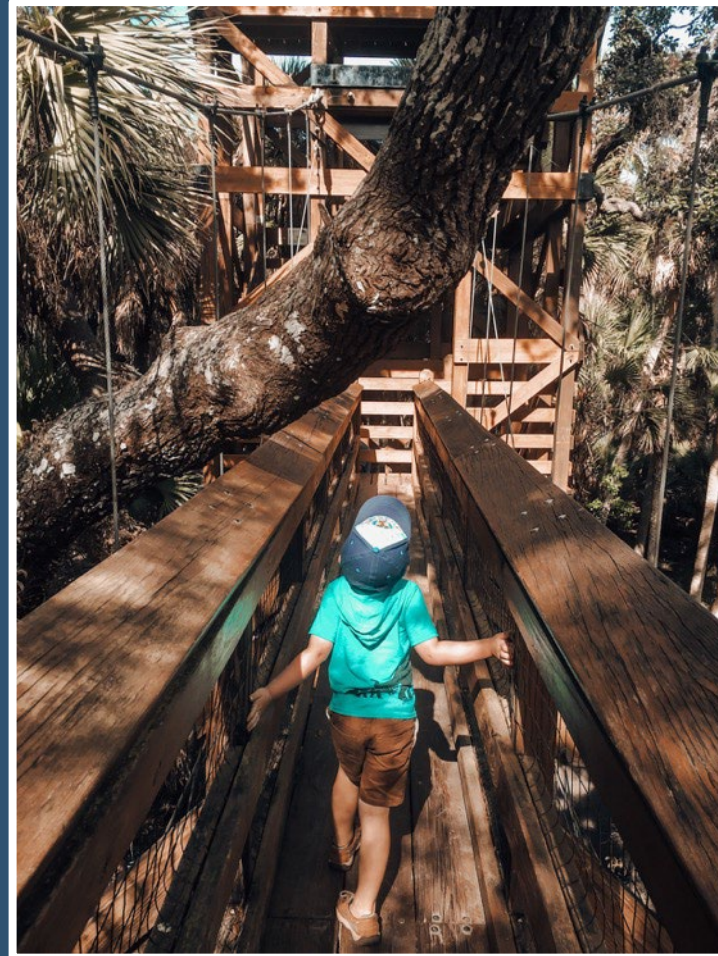

# FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

## “Technically” speaking, it’s time to replace FLAIR



- SAMAS was built in 1979
- Deployed from 1980 to 1983
- Built using Natural and COBOL programming language
- Run on a mainframe that reaches end-of-life on [June 30, 2026](#)
- “FLAIR replacement fatigue” is real

## Florida PALM Implementation

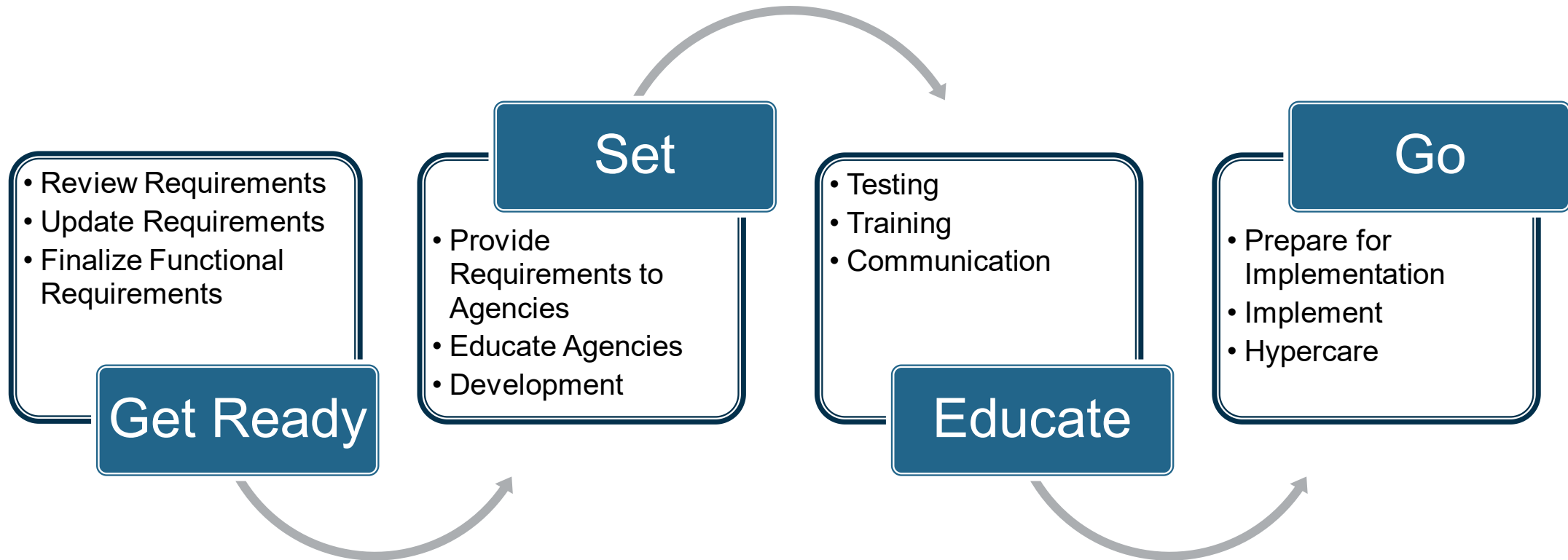


- ▶ Replace the accounting and reporting functions performed by:
  - Central FLAIR
  - Departmental FLAIR
  - PYRL
  - Information Warehouse
- ▶ **January 2026 go-live**
- ▶ All agencies will transition together

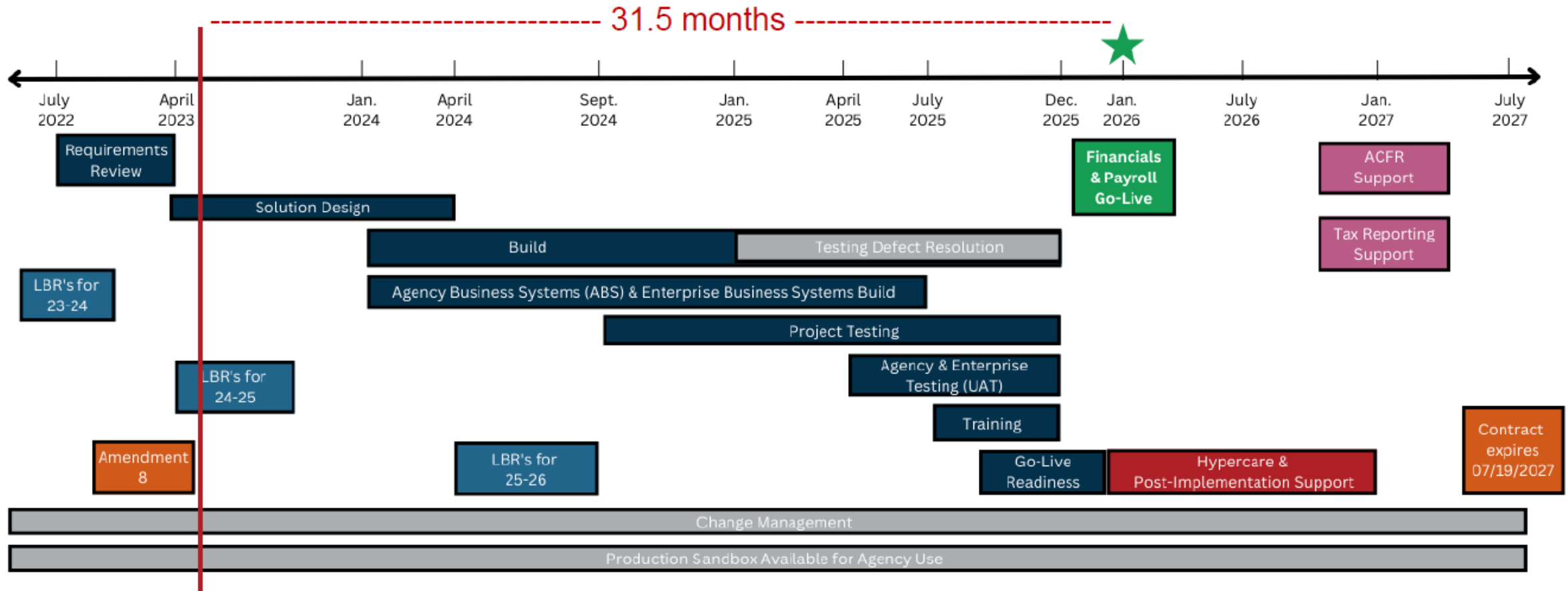

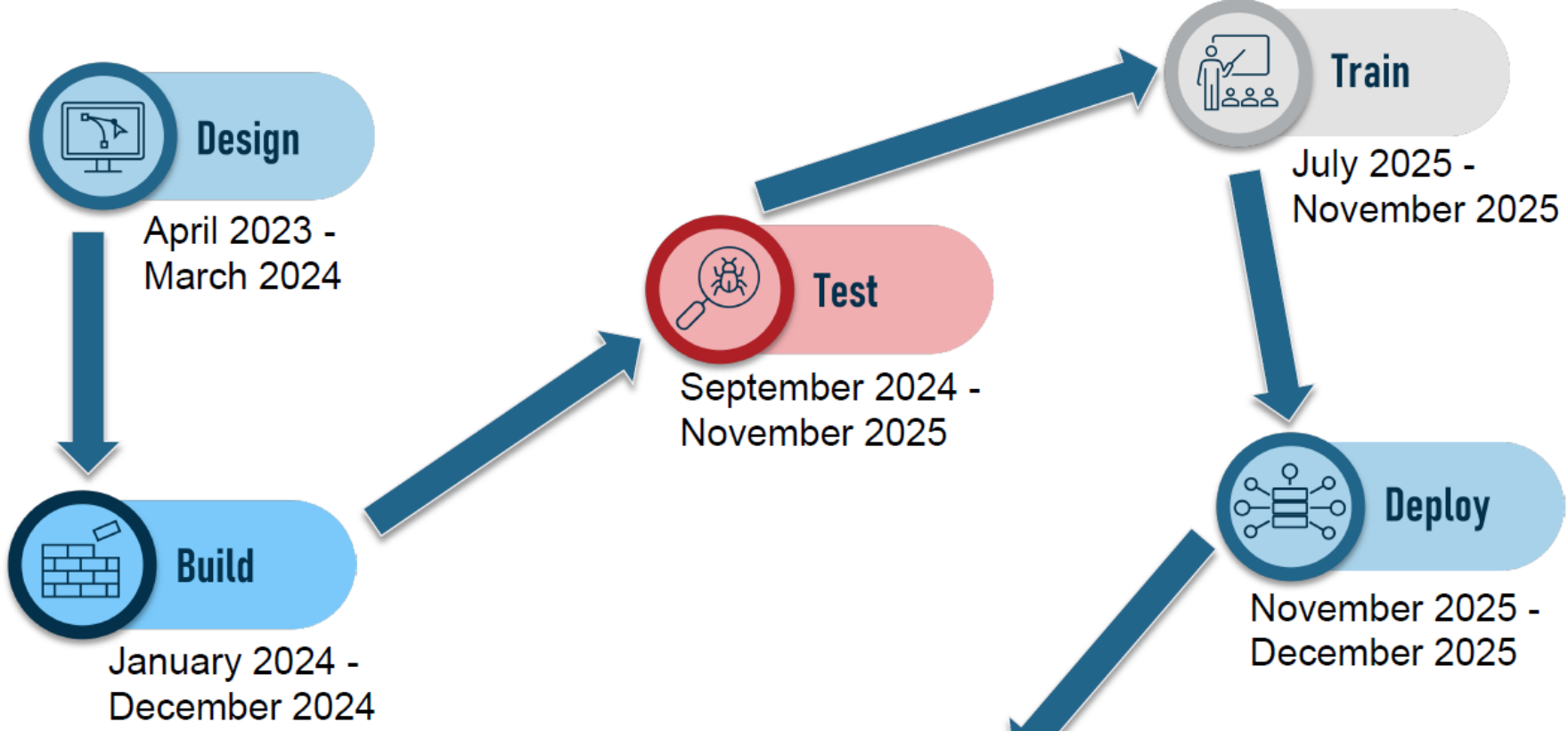

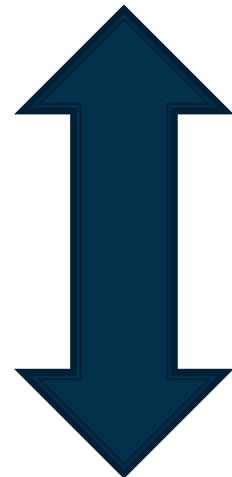

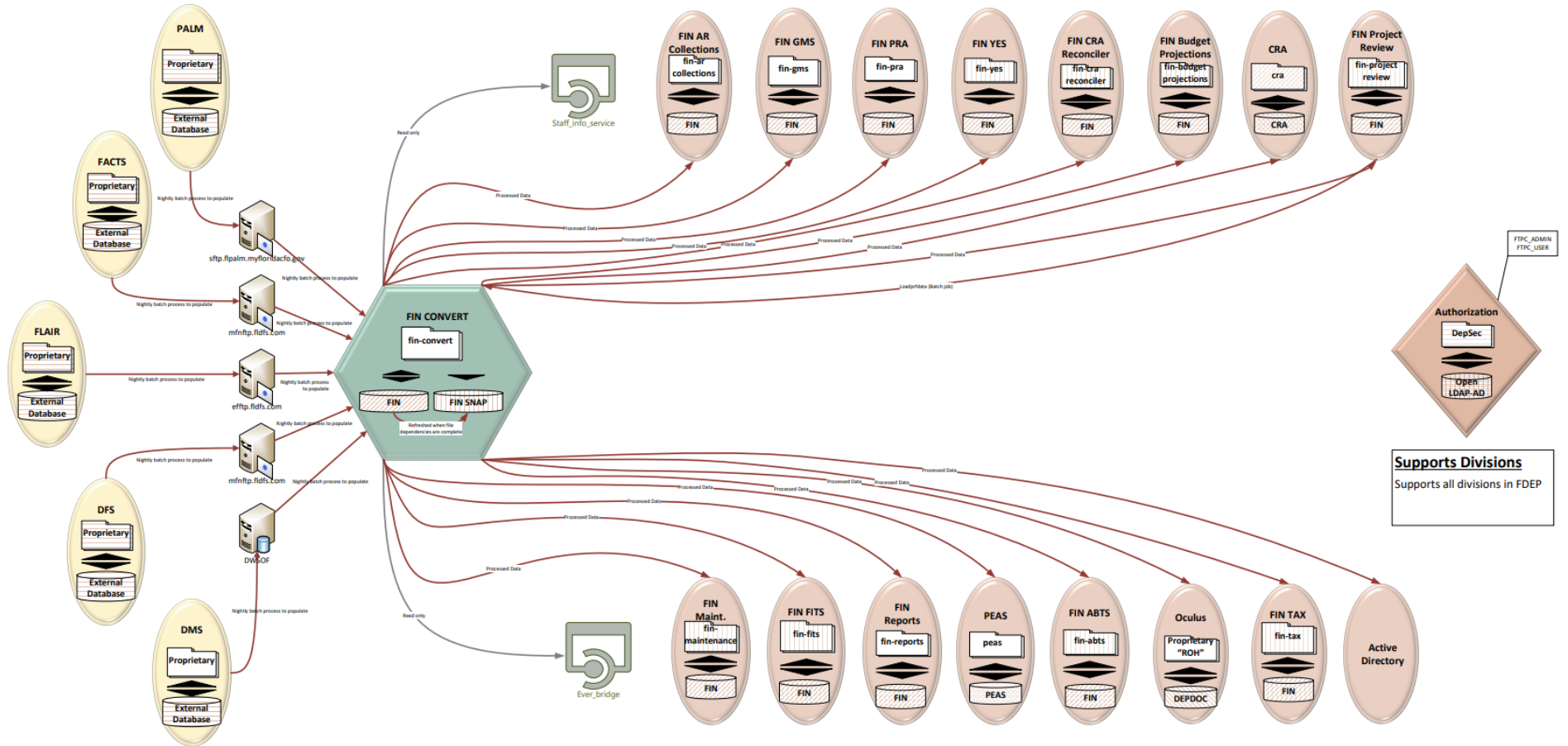

- ▶ Assist with:
  - identification of change impacts
  - development of a transformation plan
- ▶ Support your resource needs and funding requests

## Organizational Change Management

How to get end users ready

- ▶ OCM is the people side of change
  - Supporting, equipping and enabling people impacted by change
  - It is not just training
- ▶ OCM is critical for success and the approach changes throughout a project's lifecycle to meet users where they are
- ▶ Build awareness – It is not too early to start
  - Communicate with impacted end users that Florida PALM is coming
  - Share the necessity for change
  - Educate end users on why they do what they do today





# FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

## Change Champion Network

- ▶ What is the Change Champion Network (CCN)?
  - A group of experts whose purpose is to transform and ready the agency to implement Florida PALM in January 2026
  - Includes Agency Sponsor, Six Named Liaisons, and Subject Matter Experts
  - Provides dedicated and as needed support, depending on agency and subject matter complexity





# FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION

## CCN Roles & Responsibilities

### Program Business Liaison

- Coordinates and supports Florida PALM functional activities for your Division/District/Office
- Understands your Division/District/Office business and data needs
- Understands planned Florida PALM functionality
- Works closely with the Technical Liaison to understand interfaces and data conversions that are needed to maintain business operations
- Implements standardized business process changes
- Attends Florida PALM meetings, as applicable

### Program Technical Liaison

- Coordinates and supports Florida PALM technical activities for your Division/District/Office
- Understands your current technical needs for your Division/District/Office
- Understands the planned technical functions of Florida PALM (interfaces, conversions, security)
- Works closely with the Business Liaison to understand the business systems and data that need to be interfaced with, or converted to, Florida PALM
- Builds connections to Florida PALM and prepares data for conversion
- Attends Florida PALM meetings, as applicable
