Beginning July 13, Florida PALM will offer User Support Labs (USLs) to end users and members of their Tier 0 Support Team for to support completing specific non-critical work (e.g., creating query or using the disinvestment spreadsheet). This is **not** training, but an opportunity to receive hands-on assistance using Florida PALM in production. USL sessions will be held in-person at the Florida PALM Project site in Tallahassee. Virtual USL will be offered for those outside of Tallahassee.

Before attending a USL, end users should review relevant training and work with their agency's Tier 0 Support Team for better understanding of Florida PALM functionality. If additional assistance is still needed, the Tier 0 Support Team should submit a USL Request Form on behalf of their end users **at least two business days** in advanced of the requested USL session. Both the end user needing assistance and a Tier 0 Support person should attend the session to get assistance needed and increase the Tier 0 support capability for their agency.

Share the <u>USL Request Form</u> and the <u>USL Session Schedule</u> (available on the User Support Page on the Florida PALM website) with your end users and Tier 0 Support Team. MRW Task TRNG40 Register and Monitor Participation in User Support Labs task instructions will further share how to register for USL.
