 - Closed (Risk 221): Central Wave build timeline and Central Wave work for MFMP build activities are not aligned

 - Monthly IV&V reports includes technical reviews of Project deliverables and assessment of Project management governance
 - No advanced payment for contract contingency; contract contingency held in reserve pending ESC approval for unforeseen expenditures

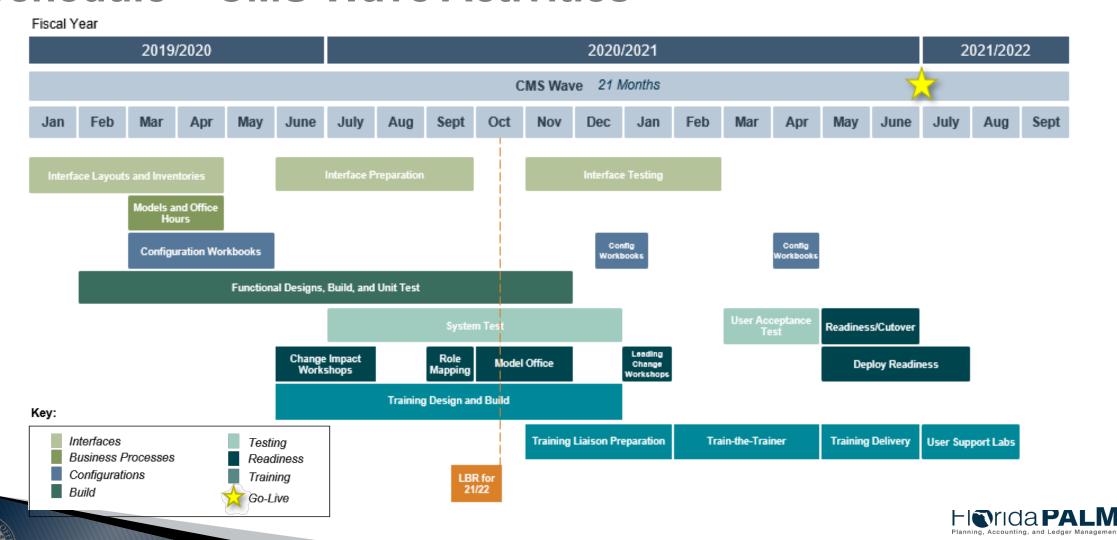

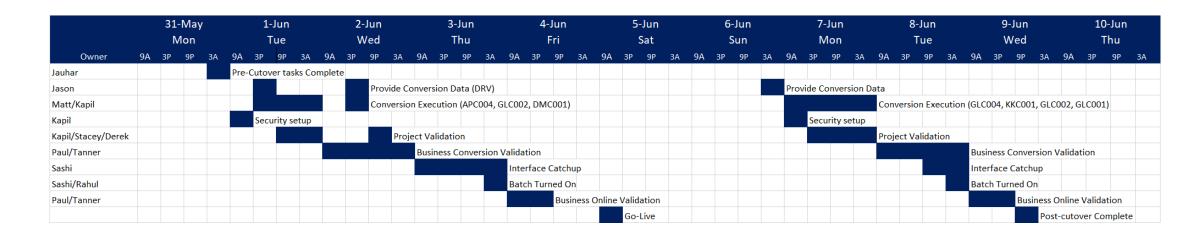
Florida PALM Project Update Schedule – CMS Wave Activities



- ▶ Full Dress Rehearsal (FDR) Completed 5/20
 - Key findings/mitigation:
 - Conversion Data Added Data Readiness Validation for business validation and signoff on conversion data prior to execution load
 - Resource contention Added resources for Project Validation and reallocated some responsibilities to other resources
 - Security setup/access Will use a security migration process to move security setup to UAT environment for FDR2
 - Communication/handoff Reviewed/streamlined communication and handoff processes
 - Action items:
 - Run FDR2 from 6/1 to 6/9



- Full Dress Rehearsal 2 (FDR2)
 - Pre-cutover rehearsal: 5/17 to 5/28, Cutover rehearsal: 6/1 to 6/5, Post-cutover rehearsal: 6/7 to 6/9





- Operations Readiness Testing in progress through May 28, 2021
 - Week 1 focused on interface connectivity, batch schedule, and agency support processes
 - Week 2 focused on production support processes and business operations
 - Week 3 focused on routine system maintenance such as patching and code migrations

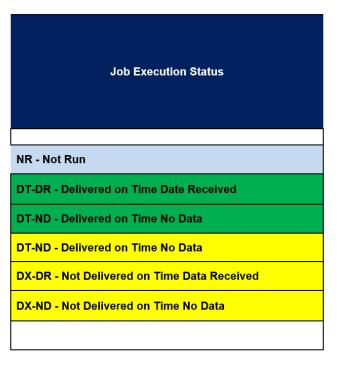


- Batch End-to-End Testing (Florida PALM/FLAIR)
 - Week 1, May 3-7 Completed technical batch testing with OIT
 - TIDAL sync with PS, automated batch runs per scheduled and design, drop files, and pickup
 - Week 2, May 10-14 Functional Validation with OIT
 - Delayed as Florida PALM experienced intermittent issues with infrastructure, configuration and migration
 - Week 3, May 17-21
 - Week 2 issues were resolved by May 18
 - Functional validation started on May 19; we encountered some more issues and decided to run the batches manually to identify and fixed the problems by May 21
 - Week 4, May 24-28
 - End-to-end automated batch testing re-started on May 24, and we made good progress; no major issues encountered till 5/24

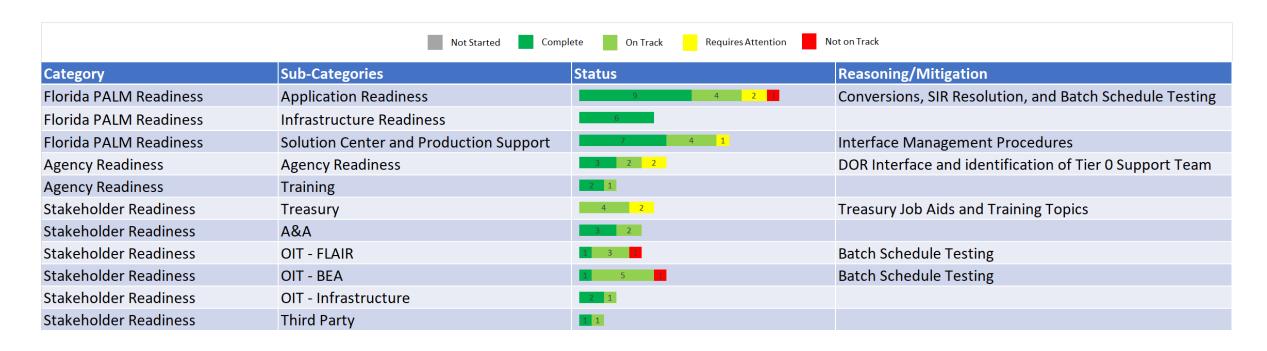

Agency Internal Readiness Indicators – CMS Wave

- The Agency Internal Readiness Indicator (AIRI) survey was developed to assess agencies' readiness for the CMS Wave as of April 2021
- ▶ This is the second AIRI survey, the first was conducted in July 2020
- Executive Steering Committee (ESC) members reviewed and finalized the readiness indicator survey statements
- Readiness indicator statements were grouped by People, Process, Technology, and Project Management
- One AIRI survey was distributed to each Agency Sponsor
- AIRI Survey used a five-point Likert scale and mandatory free-form response fields for each indicator

Agency Internal Readiness Indicators – CMS Wave

- ▶ 31 for 34 Responses Received:
 - AHCA, APD, DCF, Citrus, DACS, DOE, DOEA, DEP, DOH, DOL, DOR, DOS, DFS, DVA, DJJ, DLA, DMA, DMS, DEM, EOG, FCOR, FDC, FLHSMV, FDLE, FDOT, FSDB, FWC, JAC, LEG, PSC, SCS
- 3 Non-responses:
 - DBPR, DOE, DOAH
- All responding agencies provided a reasons for selecting their response
- Responding agencies are on track to be ready for CMS Wave launch



Florida PALM Project Update Agency Internal Readiness Indicators – CMS Wave

People

- Understanding of CMS Wave Impact
 - Majority of agencies are aware of the impacts of the CMS Wave functionality and have communicated with their end users
- Training
 - Agencies are aware training materials have been posted on the People First Learning Management System (LMS) and most created an internal training plan
- Support
 - Majority of the agencies strongly agree or agree their super users are prepared to provide Tier 0 Support
 - Some agencies were unaware of User Support Labs (USL)

Process

- Majority of agencies are on track to update and communicate Impacts to their internal business processes
- Majority understand the Chart of Accounts (COA) structure

Technology

- Majority believe their identify providers support access to Florida PALM

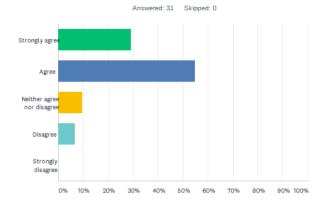

IV&V Assessment April 2021 Reporting Period

Summary Observations From the March 2021 IV&V Assessment

Current Period Prior Period Trend

Project Management planning and supervisory activities, fiscal controls, and quality controls are consistent and adhere to standard industry practices. Transparency is demonstrated and observable.

Productivity remains high with priority given to timeliness and enforcement of quality standards.

Scope control is evident and designs require minimal customization.

Positive collaboration between the State and Accenture teams continues to be demonstrated.

In April, activities were underway for CMS Wave, Central Wave, Payroll Wave, and Departmental Wave. The parallel activities present risks to schedule due to complexity, dependencies, and resource capacity.



Recent proviso developments have mandated changes to the planned Production Support model. The Project, A&A and OIT are working together to comply.



The multi-wave/multi-phase approach to implementation has inherent risks to the schedule due to the complexities of managing wave activities in parallel and the resulting potential to exceed resource capacity limits.

As of May 26, work has begun to streamline the approach by consolidating Central and Departmental Waves into a single Financials implementation. This should reduce risks by simplifying business processes, eliminating dependencies on customizations to FLAIR, and by clarifying for agencies what the new data and functionality is and when action to implement is needed.
