 - Open (Issue 25): Deal Management Interface and Conversion Testing is not aligned with Project Milestones
 - Closed (Issue 26): Bank Account Hierarchy for Wells Fargo is not Aligned with Florida PALM Configuration and Processing
- Since the last ESC meeting, no risks were logged or closed; one risk remains open
 - Open (Risk 221): Central Wave build timeline and Central Wave work for MFMP build activities are not aligned

CMS Wave Interface Testing

- Interface Testing Cycle 2 (Technical Testing) in progress through April 2021*
 - 27 total interfaces (25 completed, 2 in progress, 0 not started)
 - Inbound interfaces from 2 agencies; outbound interfaces to 7 agencies
 - Interfacing with 4 external partners
 - Testing results: 330 SIRs identified; 60 SIRs open
 - 28 High, 29 Medium, 3 Low priority
 - 15 open SIRS related to Interfaces
- Interface Testing Cycle 3 (Functional Testing) in progress
 - Does not test interfaces; validates other functionality (e.g., forms, reports) using data from the interfaces. Cycle 3 Testing conducted by the Florida PALM team only
 - <u>56</u> total scripts (55 completed, 1 in progress, 0 not started)

- Project Management planning and supervisory activities, fiscal controls, and quality controls are consistent and adhere to
 standard industry practices. Transparency is demonstrated and observable.
 - Productivity remains high with priority given to timeliness and enforcement of quality standards.
 - Scope control is evident and designs require minimal customization.
 - Positive collaboration between the State and Accenture teams continues to be demonstrated.

Activities are underway for CMS Wave, Central Wave, Payroll Wave, and Departmental Wave. The parallel activities present risks to schedule due to complexity, dependencies, and resource capacity.



CMS Wave Issue 25 involves new accounting activities with new data to be used at Treasury. While the issue remains open, it affects an isolated set of activities that Treasury and the Project appear to have sound business contingency plans in place to manage should the issue persist. : Each has a resolution plan with activities behind schedule at the end of March. While each issue presents schedule risks, these issues do not threaten the overall CMS Wave implementation. At this time, Issue 26 appears to be resolved with closure pending downstream activities.



The multi-wave/multi-phase approach to implementation has inherent risks to the schedule due to the complexities of managing wave activities in parallel and the resulting potential to exceed resource capacity limits.
