Resident Crop Hail and Multiple-Peril Crop Insurance Agent

TYPE AND CLASS:

4-30 Resident Crop Hail and Multiple-Peril Crop Insurance Agent

Common Use(s) of License:

An individual limited to transacting insurance covering crops subject to unfavorable weather conditions, fire or lightening, flood, hail, insect infestation, disease, or other yield-reducing conditions or perils which is provided by the private insurance market, or which is subsidized by the Federal Group Insurance Corporation including multi-peril crop insurance.

STEPS TO OBTAIN 4-30 RESIDENT CROP HAIL AND MULTIPLE-PERIL CROP INSURANCE AGENT:

Step 1 - You must be:

- A natural person at least 18 years of age.
- A resident of the state of Florida.
- A <u>United States citizen or legal alien</u> who possesses a work authorization from the United States Immigration and Naturalization Services.
- Not hold a resident license in another state.

Step 2 - Apply:

• Answer all of the questions and pay the fees to complete online application.

Fingerprinting fees are not included and must be paid directly to vendor

Step 3 - Fingerprints:

• You must be fingerprinted.

Step 4 - Status notification(s):

- Once an application has been submitted, you may check your <u>MyProfile</u> account for the status of your application. Deficiencies will be listed under the pending license type.
- Once all the above steps have been satisfied, the department will send your approval by email. You may then go to your MyProfile account and click the "Wallet" and/or "Letter" hyperlink(s), under the "Print Licenses" section, to generate a copy of your license for printing.

Special Note:

- Licensees must be appointed by, and the limited license requested by, a licensed General Lines agent. All business transacted by the limited agent shall be in behalf of, in the name of, and countersigned by the agent by whom the individual is appointed. The licensee may only be appointed by one General Lines agent or agency.
- You may conduct Crop Hail insurance business through a Resident General Lines (2-20) license.
- This license will expire if unappointed for 48 months. <u>Section 626.431(3)</u>, <u>Florida Statutes.</u>
- Third party access must be authorized by the licensee through MyProfile in order for the third party to manage the licensing submissions and changes on behalf of the licensee.
