2016/2017 Joint Annual Insurance Fraud/Workers' Compensation Report

The Division of Investigative and Forensic Services (DIFS) and the Division of Workers' Compensation (DWC) appreciates the opportunity to provide this joint report regarding workers' compensation fraud. Inside this report is the summary of the efforts and activities in combating workers' compensation fraud for the period of July 1, 2016 extending to June 30, 2017.

The Division of Insurance Fraud, Bureau of Workers' Compensation Fraud and the Division of Workers' Compensation, Bureau of Compliance produce a joint report annually to summarize their efforts in fighting workers' compensation fraud in Florida.

The Division of Investigative and Forensic Services (DIFS) continues to be a perennial leader in the fight against insurance fraud. During the 2016/2017 Fiscal Year, investigative efforts resulted in 1,174 cases presented for prosecution, 1,101 arrests, 1,099 successful prosecutions and received and reviewed over 16,315 referrals of suspected insurance fraud.
