History of **Non-Traditional** Learning

- The Correspondence Course
 - Dates back to 1728 Shorthand (Next 1840)
 - 1858 University of London offered diplomas and degrees (Non-Accredited).
 - Little to no interaction with teachers (remember this – we are seeing this again).
 - Very few left? Correspondence vs. Distance Learning?

Technological History of Non-Traditional Learning

- The Distance Learning Course
 - 1920's radio then television (1970's).
 - 1984 University of London offered diplomas and degrees.
 - Late 1988-1989 University of Phoenix Started Exploring Idea
 - 1997 Blackboard
 - 2003 Skype
 - 2005 UoP Recruiting
 - 2005 YouTube
 - 2011 Zoom
 - 2020-2021 COVID-19
 - 2024 UoP tried to sell to University of Idaho
 - 2023-2024 73% Classes are online.

- Few follow through
- Disapprovals:
 - Fail to provide the class to review.
 - Fail to provide JPRs that are listed in BFST Syllabus.
 - Submit a "canned class" with nothing else.

Review Process


- JPR (Build the classes with the JPRs)
- Syllabus
- Discussion Questions
- Timing mechanism.
- Test and Quizzes
 - Do not:
 - Look for similarity in classes (who is copying who).
 - Costs

Colleges and Universities

Regionally/Nationally Accredited Colleges and Universities are NOT required to follow the process listed above. To obtain Bureau of Fire Standards and Training (BFST) course approval, **Regionally/Nationally Accredited Colleges and** Universities shall submit a letter to the BFST from the Program Dean listing the certification courses they intend to teach in an online/blended format.

Approval Granted

- Email is sent.
- Class is added to the appropriate website.
- The class can then be approved in FCDICE.



What are the advantages of Online or Distance Learning Classes?

- For the student:
 - Flexible Schedule: Depending on class structure.
 - Self-Paced: Usually weekly assignments and possible ability to work ahead.
 - No travel time to class.
 - Good for Visual Learner and possibly the Audible Learner.
 - Solitary Learner.

What are the Disadvantages of Online or Distance Learning Classes?

- For the student:
 - Self-Paced: 80-95% of College Students procrastinate¹.
 - Technology requirements.
 - Physical learner and those who learn better traditionally.
 - Social Learner.
 - Cost: Technology fees, out-of-state tuition, private corporations.

- For the School:
 - Overhead Costs: Classrooms and offices.
 - Safety: No onsite location and limited interaction with students and staff (liability).
 - "Canned" Classes.
 - PROFIT: Instructor salary (adjunct), worldwide students, and potential for passive income.

What are the Disadvantages of Online or Distance Learning Classes?

- For the School:
 - Technology Costs: Platforms and support.
 - Lack of interaction with students and staff.
 - Accreditation standards may be more difficult.
 - Stigma of online classes (lessening).
 - Instructors (who are they?).
 - Competitive Market.

What are the Disadvantages of Online or Distance Learning Classes?


- For the Fire Service:






Canvas LMS



Blackboard LMS



Back to Basics

- Visual: Text, PowerPoint, video, etc.
- Auditory: Audible books or lessons.
- Kinesthetic: Physical activity.
- Active vs. Passive Learning



Be Creative

- Provide links to articles, videos, audible links and books (review them first).
- Have students create video discussion replies.
- Create video lessons yourself.
- Utilize online games for review and study (Kahoot).
- Have students video themselves teaching.

Introductions and Syllabus

- Consider a video introduction.
- Reply to the student with an original message.
- Have students reply to others' posts.
- Clear syllabus with all expectations.
- Deadlines in the syllabus.
- Consider a quiz about the syllabus.

Discussion Questions

- Relevant
- Require replies for interaction.
- Minimum standards (word count) for initial response and replies.
- Monitor for inappropriate content.
- Make interactive replies YOURSELF.
- Check for fraud, spelling, and grammar errors.
- Enforce APA or MLA standards.

Assignments

- Give clear directions and have ability to answer student questions.
- Provide rubric.
- Give examples if possible.
- Grade in timely manner and add feedback.
- Make sure assignment is correct from the instructor.
- Check for plagiarism.
