Safety Compliance Inspections

- Done regularly by the Bureau of Fire Standards & Training/Safety Section
- Trying to do inspections more pro-actively rather than re-actively so the Division is not just doing these when there is a firefighter injury, line of duty death or for the grants
- These visits would be for guidance and assistance
- We will be asking for two additional full time employees for the Safety section to assist with this in the next Legislative Budget Request (LBR).

- Positions coming soon

OLD BUSINESS:

Chairman Aviles informed the Council that he will send the Council (through Mary Ann), the finished/published white paper on the Recruitment and Retention issue.

This document will be turned over to the State for future tracking.

Director Rice reiterated that the FFIRS/FFESTC councils will be kept separate with adjustments made to agendas to avoid repetitiveness.

NEW BUSINESS:

Out of State FF/DOD Equivalency

Chief Mark Harper explained that the Out of State FF/DOD Equivalency process has been being reviewing and monitoring for quite some time now.

(Handout provided of a revised draft of the new application packet)

Within all 50 States, there are multiple ways that States provide and certify firefighters.

Florida will accept IFSAC and/or ProBoard Firefighter II certification as "equivalent training". Individuals will still be required to test for certification. This includes the written and practical examinations. A medical and fingerprinting are also required.

There is a 40-hour course that is given prior to testing. Pass rate is much higher for those who take the class. The State is contemplating taking the class back from MTC, who currently teach this class. The State can offer the class at a more affordable price and it can run regardless of registration numbers.

We do not in any way want to jeopardize our IFSAC or ProBoard accreditations in this process and how they measure proficiency. The testing process for certification must be maintained. We do not want to minimize our process.

Further discussion was held on the Equivalency process.

Council asked for tracking data on Equivalency applicants and 40-hour Equivalency course.

Council Input

Tom DiBernardo gave an update on the DOH/Fire suicide statistics – EMT, Fire, Paramedic (accounting for dual certified individuals). The data they have collected is being evaluated for validity and then he will present to Council at the November meeting.
