OLD BUSINESS:

- Update from Department of Health on Suicide Data
 - \circ No discussion held.
- Out of State/DOD Data/Listening Session
 - Councilman, Kevin Reed gave recap from the Training Directors Association perspective from the Listening Session
 - Florida growth outpacing employment need and the number of students graduating from the Minimum Standards program.
 - Categories that need to be addressed
 - All certifications need to be reviewed in addition to Firefighter.
 - The Training Directors Association recommends establishing a committee for research and review and bring results back to the Standards Council.
 - Director Rice has received several names interested in participating in the work group. First meeting to be held at Florida Fire Conference in January.

NEW BUSINESS:

Chief Darrel Donatto

- Updated on FFCA Legislation
 - Firefighter Safety/Roadside Emergencies HB-463
 - This bill would enable fire trucks to display blue warning lights on the rear of the truck when operating on an emergency scene.
 - Studies have shown that blue is the most effective color at night while red is most effective and visible during the day. Studies recommend a combination of red and blue for the best protection. 29 States already allow fire trucks to display blue warning lights.
 - House Bill is filed believe Senate sponsor is committed.
 - This is not only for firefighter personnel safety but also the safety of the trucks which take time to have repaired which can prove to be a significant hardship on organizations.
- Apprenticeship Program for Fire Service
 - This would be a state funded program that would allow a fire department to hire a non-certified person, pay them a percentage of their firefighter salary to go to EMT school. Once completed EMT school, they would get a bump in pay. They would then go to fire school and once completed get an additional bump in pay. Complete on-the-job training and then when completed, roll onto the fire department payroll with the regular pay.

Chief Carlos Aviles

- Recruitment/Retention Reboot
 - The State will be launching the survey by the end of the year or early next year.

• Possible statement sent out by SFM (A-List) asking fire service personnel to participate in survey/registry.

Tom DiBernardo – EMS

- As of July 1, 2024, the national paramedic exam will no longer have a practical component.
- New paramedic schools leaning heavily toward on-line. Clinicals would still be required.

Chairman Aviles asked for guidance from SFM Legal on council members participating in the Out-of-State/DOD workgroup and discussing that process outside of the quarterly FFESTC meetings– Sunshine Law
