Welcomed new member Darrel Donatto, appointed by the League of Cities

Requested a moment of silence to all fire service members that are no longer with us and also for Wayne Watts, for a speedy recovery.

REPORT FROM DIVISION: given by Julius Halas, Director

Grants - Florida Fire Service has been quite successful in the last five years.

- 2017/2018 9 million dollars in grants (combined)
- 2018/2019 up to 16 million (combined)
- 2019/2020 14 million
- 2020/2021 6% hold back was released
- Over 50 million in grants in the last five years (with no new staffing for SFM)

Legislation

- o Passed
- o Funding for an additional Rehabilitation Center for the Fire College
- o 500,000 Domestic Security Funding
- o Proposed changes to S. 633.426, F.S., allows existing fire service providers to create a process by which it allows existing volunteer firefighters who are already certified (FF I), to become employed and earn FF II within a period of 1 year while working under the supervision of a full-time certified firefighter.
- Proposed changes to S. 633.136 and 633.402, F.S., aligns the Fire Incident Reporting Systems Council (FFIRS) and the Firefighter Employment, Standards, and Training Council members to include a Department of Health representative
- Did not Pass
 - Request for new FCDICE system request for Council letter of support for next year

Further discussion was held on legislation

On a motion duly made, the Council will support a new FCDCE system and submit a letter of support to the CFO.

Motion carried.

REPORT FROM THE BUREAU: given by Michael Tucker, Bureau Chief

2020 was a challenging year. The Fire College is now back open at full capacity but still with some smaller class sizes.

FCDICE

Data cleanup ongoing. Working with fire departments with mergers, rosters, etc. Continuing to share data with the Department of Health, the Governor's office, and the office of vital statistics. 17% reduction after clean-up of deceased profiles. We are currently at 511 fire departments recognized in the system.

Volunteer Section - Grow As You Go

- Individuals within volunteer organizations can take FF I on-line
- Currently 468 students enrolled (at different stages of the program)
- 107 certificates have already been issued through this program for completion
- We continue to try to market this program throughout the State with volunteer and combination departments.
- Volunteer Grant since inception in 2018, we have awarded 3.7 million dollars. This year, (ytd) we have awarded another \$850,000 which brings us to 4.6 million dollars awarded for PPE, SCBA, etc.

IFSAC/ProBoard Accreditation

• Anticipating our IFSAC site visit this coming August. Bureau is ready

Certifications

• 2020 small drop in certifications due to COVID

Supplemental Compensation

• Continue to face funding shortfalls for fourth quarter

LFTI

• Updates being worked on, Listening Sessions will be held across the State

FSFC Fire Apparatus

 Submitted for a grant to replace FSFC engine, waiting on word. Our current aerial is out of service. When class is offered, we are left to borrow an aerial from Ocala Fire Rescue or other local departments
