### **REPORT FROM DIVISION:** Julius Halas, Director SFM

- Florida Fires Annual Report is out
- Introduction of Simon Blank, Director, Division of Investigative & Forensic Services
- CFO Patronis continuing with former CFO Atwater's initiatives and is very supportive of the fire service and law enforcement
- Fire Service Awards

  - o March 7, 2018, Memorial, and Cabinet meeting

### **REPORT FROM FFIRS:** Wayne Watts, FFIRS Section

- Active Hurricane Season
- Goal for upcoming year is to have the Annual Report completed before midsummer
- 468 departments currently participate in reporting, continuing to work with those who do not
- Continuing to work with FSFC on training opportunities
- Statistics YTD
  - o 40,683 fire calls
  - o 1,584,480 EMS calls
  - Over 500,000 non-fire EMS/calls (assistance, special ops, law enforcement)
  - o 52,828 mutual aid
  - o 923 firefighter injuries
  - o 179 civilian injuries

Florida still leads the nation in reporting.

### **REPORT FROM EMS:** Joshua Sturms, Bureau of EMS

- The EMS Advisory Council meeting is being held on Friday at 9:00 a.m.
- The October meeting was cancelled due to the hurricane
- EMRC committee which was disbanded, has started back up.
  - o Look at ways to improve EMT and Paramedic competencies
  - o Goal is for the committee to be a conduit for statistics which would lead to research and ultimately improve patient care
- Legislature
  - o HB 249 (Opioids)
    - Would require departments to do additional data collection and reporting on overdoses
    - Currently required to provide a quarterly report and to make the data available within 120 hours to local providers including EMS, fire, law enforcement and public health officials
    - Pilot program including several counties is well underway and testing a bio surveillance system and will provide real time dashboards so responders have access to records. This system can be used for more than just opioids, it may be used also for crash data, flu statistics, etc.
    - Grant awarded through CDC for additional funding
  - o EMSTARS
    - Currently three different versions
      - 1.4, 3.0, 3.4
    - Difficult to support all versions and trying to get everyone on the same version. Will be setting a firm date for transition, looking for something fair and reasonable so as not to effect reporting.
  - o HB 1295/SB1796
    - Updates to Ch. 401 clarification of educational requirements, etc.
  - o Tracking of other Bills ongoing
