TO: Florida Employers Requesting Workers' Compensation Premium Reimbursements for Students Participating in Work-Based Learning Programs

SUBJECT: Section 446.54, F.S., Reimbursement for Workers' Compensation Premiums – Work-Based Learning Program

As of July 1, 2023, the Florida Legislature has changed the referenced law to make the Department of Financial Services (DFS) the agency responsible for reimbursing employers' workers' compensation premiums for students in Work-Based Learning (WBL) Programs.

Employers, including school districts and Florida College System Institutions, may apply to DFS for reimbursement of workers' compensation premiums. Premiums are reimbursed based on the State of Florida's fiscal year (July 1 through June 30). DFS will be accepting and processing reimbursement applications for eligible premium paid in FY 2024 – 2025 during FY 2025 – 2026. The webpage below informs employers how to submit its workers' compensation premium reimbursement application to DFS including required documentation, employer checklist and FAQs.
